Search Team Member Commitments

Personal Fitness Commitment

As a search team member I:

1. **For Wilderness Searcher:** Must maintain my physical fitness to be able to carry a 12kg pack over difficult terrain for two consecutive 8-10 hour days, with an in-the-field overnight rest. (if Light Searcher only draw a line through this paragraph).

For Light Searcher: Must maintain my physical fitness to be able to carry a 6k day-pack for 8-10 hours in an urban, coastal or rural environment.

2. Must be in good general health.
3. Must be aware of my own limitations and convey these to the team leader BEFORE beginning any training or search.

General Commitments

As a search team member I will:

1. Attend regularly scheduled local field member training, as well as whole-of-TSLAR group training, which will be a mix of evening sessions, weekend daytime sessions and at least one overnight weekend session.

Minimum requirement: participate in 50% of field and whole-of-group training sessions.

2. Attend the necessary national level LandSAR training courses within the first 12 months of becoming a search team member. The current minimum courses are:
 - a. First Aid
 - b. Search Techniques
 - c. Tracking Core Skills

Minimum requirement: Pass all three courses within 12 months of joining TSLAR.

3. Attend a local SAREX (overnight simulated full-on search and rescue exercise) each year. If I am unable to attend a local SAREX I must let the training coordinator know in advance AND arrange to participate in a SAREX with another regional group (Rotorua, Hamilton, Whakatane, etc) during the year.

Minimum requirement: Participate in at least one local or regional SAREX annually.

4. Always respond by email or telephone to indicate whether or not I will be attending each local training session and SAREX.

Minimum requirement: Register for training as soon as possible, or if you are unable to attend local training notify the training coordinator at least 90% of the time.

5. Generally be available for searches.

Minimum requirement: Be available for 50% of searches where your assistance has been requested.

6. Ensure I have adequate personal equipment and provisions readily available for use in training sessions and searches. (A list covering minimum and recommended personal equipment will be provided.)

Minimum requirement: Attend training sessions and searches with sufficient and appropriate personal equipment.

7. Acknowledge that any clothing and/or equipment issued to me remain the property of TLSAR. I will use the clothing and/or equipment only for LandSAR related activities and will look after this with due care (cleaning, etc). I will return any clothing and/or equipment to TLSAR immediately upon any of the following:

- a. A request being made by a TLSAR committee member;
- b. My TLSAR membership being terminated;
- c. Upon my resignation from TLSAR.

Minimum requirement: All issued clothing and/or equipment is looked after with due care and is returned as per any of the above conditions.

8. Ensure that information relating to any of the following is conveyed to a member of the TLSAR committee, who will treat the information with appropriate confidentiality and sensitivity:

- a. Notable decline in my personal fitness;
- b. health issues that would affect my ability to undertake training or searches;
- c. personal circumstances that would affect my availability to undertake training or searches;

(Injured or ill members are automatically given an excused leave of absence while their health recovers. Changes to personal circumstances will be discussed and considered on a case-by-case basis.)

Minimum requirement: Notify a TLSAR committee member as soon as possible should any of the above situations arise.

Code of Conduct for Tauranga LandSAR Members

This document describes the expectations and guiding principles for appropriate behaviours within the land search and rescue environment and applies to all members of LandSAR groups within New Zealand.

As a member, I am committed to:

Carrying out my role, duty or activity with due care and diligence in a safe, competent and effective manner

- Respecting the rights, dignity, and worth of others;
- Being fair, considerate and honest in all dealings with others;
- Being professional, showing maturity and accepting responsibility for my actions;
- Providing quality service;
- Being a positive role model in the community;
- Ensuring the privacy and confidentiality of all persons and adhering to any media policy or requirements including the use of social media;
- Advising my Group committee if I become aware of any breaches of this Code of Conduct;
- Inform my Group committee of any criminal charges laid against me or proceedings that may show up on a criminal record.
- Not publish or present publicly or in the media, including social media, your views that may be interpreted as being of those of LandSAR or the above Group;
- Not acting in a way that may bring LandSAR or its stakeholders such as New Zealand Police into disrepute;
- Not publish, display, share, promote or cause promotion of any details, photographs, images of any search and rescue operations, without the express permission of the authorized person of the agency for whom the operation was performed. This includes all forms of electronic, print, social, radio or television media;
- Not being a bully or harassing people or using offensive language;
- Respecting and using all equipment appropriately and as required for my assignment;
- Not carrying out my duties or engaging in any LandSAR activity when adversely affected by alcohol, drugs or other substances;
- Not unlawfully discriminating against anyone;
- Following safe workplace practices, including participation in applicable training sessions, using appropriate personal safety equipment and reporting accidents, injuries, and unsafe situations;
- Taking personal responsibility to ensure that I am fit and attend formal and informal training so that I am role competent, current and ready to respond when required;
- Not using my membership for personal gain, commercial enterprise, or the promotion of professional services;
- Recognizing that I have a responsibility to adhere to the rules and procedures of my LandSAR Group.
